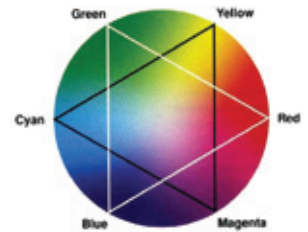


Who Should Attend?
